AP Courses:

Students may choose to take an AP Course during their 10th grade year. AP Courses are college-level, Advanced Placement Courses. These courses allow students the challenge of a college-level course, while also gaining credit toward high school graduation. Students should be ready for the rigorous constraints of a college-level course. Students who elect to take an AP course, are committed to taking the AP exam in May. The cost of the exam varies each year and is set by the College Board, the company that hosts the AP network. Last year's AP exam fee was \$92 per exam. If a student successfully completes the AP course with a C- or above, and completes the AP exam, a weighted GPA will be earned for each semester's AP course. A student who does not complete the AP exam will receive the course grade as an unweighted GPA. The weighted grading system takes into account the additional workload.

Students may also choose to take one class period per semester to complete academic tasks/homework.

College Admission Standards

Including the classes that Regina requires for graduation, there are other courses students may need to prepare for their future. Because many Regina students are interested in furthering their education after high school, we encourage students to add other core courses to their schedule as their schedule allows.

Below are the admission requirements at Iowa's three state universities, which may be similar at other colleges and universities around the state and nation. It is recommended that students look carefully at the admission standards for all colleges and universities they may be considering.

Admissions Requirements at Regents Institutions

Core Course Dept.	Optimum requirements for admission
English	4 years with an emphasis on the communication skills of writing, reading, and listening, and the analysis and interpretation of literature.
Mathematics	4 Years, one in each year of high school. This must include two years of Algebra and one of Geometry. It is highly recommended to gain an understanding of Trigonometry and/or Calculus.
Science	4 years, one each year of high school. To be really well prepared a minimum of one year of Biology, Chemistry and Physics.
Social Studies	3 years, one year of World and US History. Additional courses in Economic, Government and Psychology will give the incoming student an advantage.
Foreign Language	2 Years of a single foreign language is required for admission to the College of Liberal Arts at The University of Iowa and Iowa State University. No foreign Language is required for Admission to The University of Northern Iowa. 4 Years of a single foreign language is the optimum recommendation.
