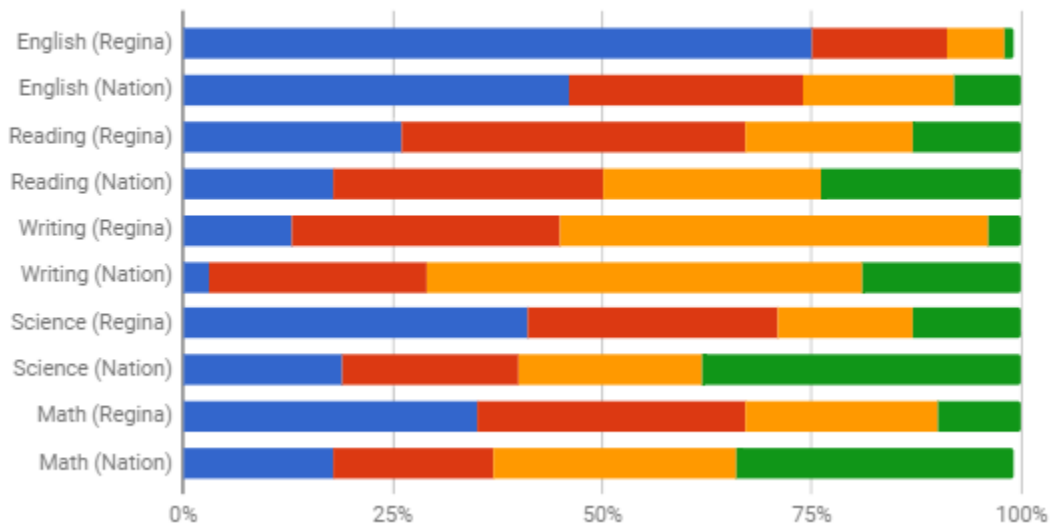

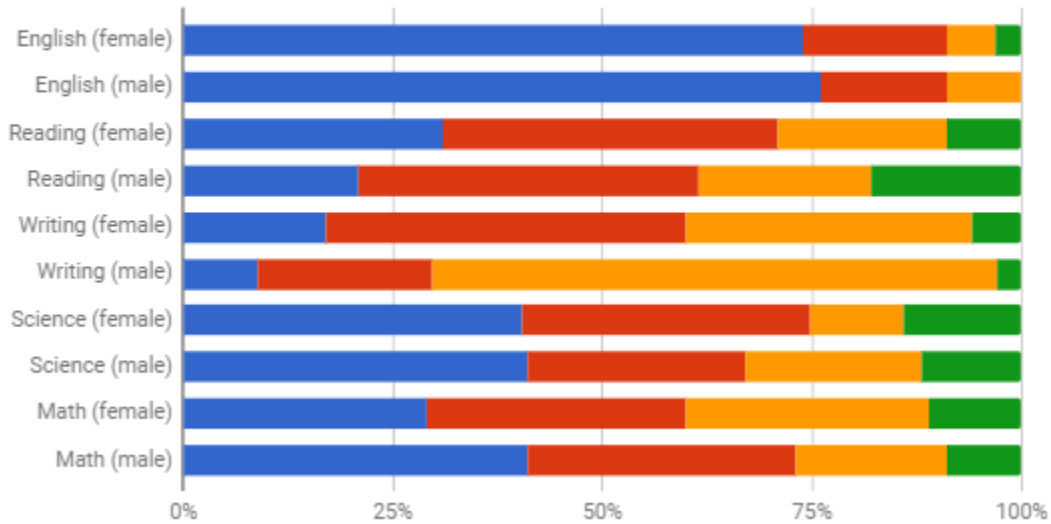

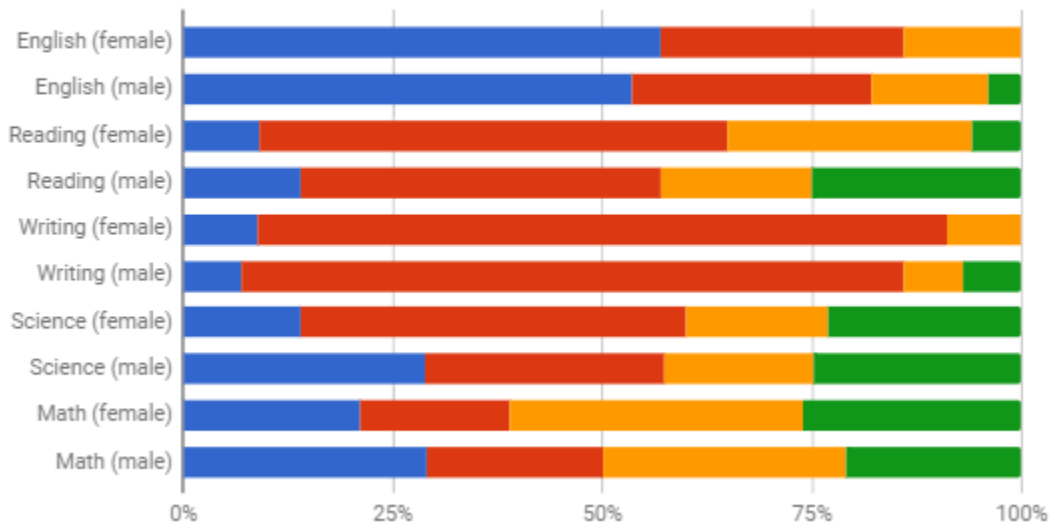

Business Office –

- Capital campaign expenditure summary / detail is up-to-date.
- STO Contributions are being accepted. Regina is at 21.8% of our allowed contribution of \$381,000. The STO is at 33% of its goal of \$1,263,535. Each member school has until November 30 to achieve its goal, however, we must work aggressively to be sure we receive our share of the donation.
- Fiscal year is wrapped up, and reports have been submitted to Hills Bank, as required, and to the Diocese.
- We received our annual payment from the State of Iowa for Non-Public Transportation this week. The amount was \$155K, which is \$40K less than last year. The reduction is due to the State of Iowa formula which states that payout is based on the lower of our per student cost and that of the public system (ICCS), along with Iowa's budget reductions in determining the per cent of payout. As we have said in prior years, we do not know the payout until after the school year is over. More to come as we go through the budget process.
