Capital Campaign

\$3,088,812 raised to date from 179 gifts and pledges.

The campaign cabinet is continuing visits with major gift prospects and are in the process of sending introductory emails to "Group B" prospects. Donor packets and request letters were sent to 110 Group B prospects the week of Feb. 20.

A report and strategy meeting for campaign parent volunteers was held February 22. Parent volunteers are continuing to make calls and setting up visits with current parents. Andrew Menke is continuing to train and assign follow-up calls to volunteers for current parents who will not receive a personal visit.

Kecia Boysen and Andrew Menke started the selection process for soliciting businesses. A final review will be made the week of February 20. Seven grant applications are in the process of being submitted for corporate/foundation funding.

The alumni captain selection process began on February 22.

Jim & Anne Kelly, Chris & Erin Klitgaard, Dan & Janan Rustan, Patrick & Sarah Tierney and Mark & Yvonne Kock hosted a Cocktail and Conversation event on Sunday, February 26 at the Kelly's home. 97 were invited to attend.

Annual Appeal

\$192,283 raised to date. Last year at this time we were at \$184,607.

To date, the Foundation has paid out \$192,984.45 to Regina out of the \$210,000.00 promised through the 2015-2016 Annual Appeal. Unpaid pledges total \$16,185.00 and pledges totaling \$830.55 have been written off. Pledge reminders were mailed for the fourth time on February 21. We are looking into Civco Medical Solutions' pledge of \$5,000.00 for the bio-medical engineering program. \$2,900.00 in pledges are matching gifts that we are waiting on.

Finance Committee No Meeting in February Updates for the Committee & Board for the Month of February 2017

- Budget Alan and the administrators have met and discussed a budget that would have us balanced. With principals individually, each line item of their respective budget was reviewed. Several items will be tweaked as some quotes and guidelines come to us in coming weeks. Budget will be discussed at the committee level in March; however, we have not yet determined if the budget will be presented to the Board in March, April, or another month.
- Portions of Phase 0 of the Capital Project will begin after spring break. Anticipated work at that time will be excavation work on the 1st Avenue Drive and Barrel Roof replacement. Other aspects of Phase 0 will begin after school is out.
- A mid-year review of tuition receivables is occurring in February and continuing into March. Some accounts will be turned over to collection when warranted.
- Michelle W., Angela, and Alan met with two individuals with ICCSD personnel regarding the busing contract for 2017-18 (a reminder that June 30 ends our current 3 year agreement). A contract is required with ICCSD for any state funding of our routes. There are no guarantees to what the state will pay; just this is the only mechanism that allows the school to receive such payments. We agreed on a one-year extension of the current contract with our goal being to bring ICCSD, Regina, and Durham in to common terms for lengths of the contracts.

ADDENDUM TO CONTRACT FOR NONPUBLIC STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

This Addendum to Contract for Nonpublic Student Transportation ("Addendum") is entered into as of the _____ day of ______, 2017, by and between **Iowa City Community School District** (hereinafter referred to as the "**District**") and **Regina Inter-Parish Catholic Education Center** (hereinafter referred to as the "**Contractor**").

RECITALS

- A. District and Contractor have previously entered into a written Contract for Nonpublic Student Transportation dated July 1, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as the "**Contract**"), in which District agreed to pay Contractor to provide school transportation services to certain nonpublic students, and Contractor agreed to provide school transportation services to certain nonpublic students.
- B. The Contract provided for a term of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2017. District and Contractor now wish to extend the Contract.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

In consideration of the foregoing recitals and the following terms and conditions, District and Contractor hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated by reference into this Addendum.
- 2. <u>Definitions</u>. All terms used herein, unless otherwise specified, shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Contract.
- 3. <u>Extension of Term</u>. Provided neither party is in default of the Contract, upon the June 30, 2017 expiration of the current term, the term of the Contract shall be extended from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.
- 4. <u>Other Terms and Conditions Remain</u>. Except as amended hereby, all of the other terms and conditions of the Contract remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
- 5. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Addendum shall inure to the sole benefit of the parties hereto. Nothing contained herein shall create, or be construed to create, any right in any person not a party to this Addendum; provided that, however, this Addendum shall be binding on the parties and their respective successors and assigns.
- 6. <u>Counterparts/Facsimile or Electronic Signatures</u>. This Addendum may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument. The use of facsimile or pdf signatures for the execution of this Addendum shall be binding and shall have the same full force and effect as if originally signed.
