### SIAC Committee Meeting October 11, 2016 4:30-5:30 High School Media Center

**Members Present:** Chad Hageman, Glenn Plummer, Celeste Vincent, Bill Battistone, Erin Vorwerk, Laura James, Katherine Sprengelmeyer, Ray Colony, Johna Leddy with guest Rick Larew

**Literacy Overview:** FAST-elementary (Celeste or Bill), I-Ready- junior high (Glenn or Tim) Mr. Battistone and Mrs. Vincent talked about the FAST testing that is done in the elementary school. It has been done with primary grades K-3 for two years, but the intermediate grades 4-6 were added this year. The tests in the early grades look at fluency and comprehension, while the intermediate is only testing on fluency at this time. The testing is administered three times a year (beginning, middle, and end of the year). Last year's data showed tremendous growth from one testing time to the next. For the most part students have been doing quite well with the testing. In the junior high, Mr. Plummer talked about I-Ready for both reading and math. This program is just administered to students who are below level reading level or not proficient on math standards, Mr. Plummer said that students on this computer based program have made significant gains.

**Technology Update:** Chromebooks in grades 7-12 (Glenn), what are the needs of teachers? (all) Mr. Plummer talked about the use of Chromebooks as did several of the teachers in attendance. The Chromebooks have been working well with few to any technical issues and students are being responsible for them and their care. Some teachers in the junior and high school have made the comment that the Chromebooks have "made them better teachers." It was said that they are adding rigor to the curriculum with the use of the Chromebooks. Turnaround for the Chromebooks is set at every 3 years, with the next ones being touch screen. Some classes are starting to incorporate online textbooks and this will happen more in the future as curriculum needs updating. It can be a cost savings as only one classroom set of hard cover books would be purchased along with the license to use the virtual books online.

**ACT/Regina Partnership:** Presentation by Rick Larew for the SIAC Committee's consideration Rick Larew presented on a possible partnership with ACT of Iowa City. Something like this was brought up about 10 years ago and it didn't make it to final stages. This may be something similar, but the SIAC committee decided to entertain a presentation by ACT to find out more about this possibility and what benefits would be extended to Regina. More to come on this after our November meeting when we will be hearing a presentation from them.

- We have received a formal "move out" notice from our tenant at the 2218 Rochester property. We have a potential renter beginning December 1; so will keep you apprised of this transition.






