



WHAT IS AP?

The Advanced Placement (AP) program offers high school students the opportunity to receive university credit while still in high school. There are over 35 AP courses offered throughout the nation. Students who enroll in these courses will take the AP exam at the end of the year and, based on their performance, may receive more or less university credit depending on the college or university to which they apply. (5=highest, 1=lowest)

REGINA AP GRADE WEIGHTING

Regina AP classes receive grade weighting. Rationale: the quantity of work and the quality of Regina AP classes or online AP classes are very demanding as compared to the grade level counterpart class. The following scale is used: (below C-, the grade weighting returns to regular grade scale).

AP GRADE POINT SCALE

A 4.50 B 3.25 C 2.10 D 1.00 F .00
