The Sound of Music could only have come together through the commitment of numerous students, teachers, volunteers, musicians, and financial supporters. It occurred to me that similar to a theater production, Regina itself is a “wonderful show” made possible by the dedication and commitment of so many. From our faculty, staff, and administrators to our parishes, boards, volunteers, and generous benefactors, everyone plays an important “role” in Regina’s success.

I’m pleased to share several exciting updates from the Foundation. The annual fundraising appeal has a new name, the **EXCELLENCE FUND**, since this fund helps Regina students achieve academic and spiritual excellence. Gifts to the **EXCELLENCE FUND**’s \$450,000 goal will assist Regina with important initiatives including teacher salary increases, tuition assistance, special projects, and operating expenses. Through the generosity of donors, we are able to offer a record 64 scholarships to Regina students for this upcoming academic year. The Foundation also received four new planned gifts this year from donors who included Regina in their estate planning. Additionally, Regina’s long-term endowments provided payouts to the school totaling over \$220,000 over the past year.

Executive Director, Kecia Boysen, and Development Coordinator, Shelley Rublaitus, continue to do great work day in and day out, leading and managing the Foundation. We thank Chrissy Chambliss for her outstanding leadership over the past 10 years as a Foundation committee chair, board member, and president; we are fortunate to have had her. Although we say goodbye to Chrissy, we are excited to welcome Greg McLaughlin to our executive committee and Mark Ray to the Foundation board. We continue to be blessed with dedicated and talented board and subcommittee members.

As I look about Regina’s campus and walk its hallways, I am grateful that my 5th and 8th grade boys are receiving a faith-based education in a supportive and safe environment. I am grateful to our parishes for their significant financial support of Regina. And I am grateful to the teachers, administrators, staff, volunteers, and generous donors, past and present, who make our wonderful school possible.

BUILDING OUR FUTURE

SOMEONE ONCE SAID THE FUTURE IS TODAY. WELL, IF IT ISN'T TODAY, IT'S GETTING VERY, VERY CLOSE!

I am reminded of this more and more these days as I look forward to my grandson, Bowen, starting kindergarten at Regina this fall. Doesn't seem possible – my little third generation Regal! But he is only ONE reason that I have continued my involvement at Regina for over three decades. A few years ago, I wrote that Regina is a jewel in our community, and I believe this even more so today. Regina remains as vibrant and strong as ever. Among the many things that set us apart, is the opportunity that we provide for children to receive a faith and values-based education. This one constant in our community is needed more than ever these days.

A year ago, in my role as co-chair of the *Pride in Our Past, Building our Future* Capital Campaign, I asked you to consider supporting our campaign to help Regina to grow and update some of our aging facilities. Today I am proud to announce that we have raised \$4.84 million in cash, pledges and in-kind gifts. We have re-surfaced the barrel roof of our gymnasium, completely renovated and updated both the boys and girls locker rooms, re-surfaced the front circle and expanded and re-surfaced the front parking lot. In addition, the new First Avenue entrance/exit to our campus is in use and we held a ribbon cutting for our new Regina Athletic Training Facility! This addition to our campus was made possible by a generous donor who is paying close to 50% of the total cost of this facility. Through this gift, we have a state-of-the-art hitting facility for our baseball and softball teams, as well as new strength training and wrestling rooms. The last two items were "Phase 2" components of our original capital campaign, but due to the donation of this wonderful hitting facility we were able to locate them on the bottom floor of this building at a fraction of the original cost of a brick and mortar addition to the school. This has also allowed us to modify our building plans and make the proposed school addition one floor as opposed to two as originally planned. Again, this will save us an enormous amount of money as we strive to be good stewards of your donations. The final architectural renderings are being completed for the new educational wing and other components of the capital campaign. I thank you for your generous support of this campaign, but please know that your continued support of this incredible project is still needed!

We are building many good things at Regina: academically, spiritually and physically. Please continue to be a part of our journey! There are still opportunities to support both our Capital Campaign as well as the Regina Foundation **EXCELLENCE FUND** (annual appeal), which helps to defray a portion of our school's operating costs and ensures the future of Regina through endowments. As always, if you are in the area please stop in for a tour, talk to our staff and administrators, and learn more about the exciting things happening at Regina.

Please consider Regina as an opportunity to "Pay it Forward."

REGINA CATHOLIC EDUCATION CENTER



The *Pride in Our Past, Building Our Future* Capital Campaign is an extraordinary effort that will impact Regina for decades to come.

Not only will campaign funds allow Regina to address mounting structural concerns and limitations, they also facilitate our strategy to grow enrollment and further distinguish Regina as the premier choice for faith-based education in the area.



REGINA ATHLETIC TRAINING FACILITY

The project was made possible due to cost savings and an additional specified donation. The building houses a state-of-the-art hitting facility on the top floor. The lower level is the new home for strength and conditioning, wrestling, and a film room.

NEW EDUCATIONAL WING

A primary focus for growing enrollment is to expand our Early Childhood Center with modern facilities. The current space can only accommodate 80 students and will be expanded to increase to 125. The new Educational Wing will include four early childhood classrooms, a new science lab, four additional classrooms and collaborative flex teaching space.

UPGRADED HIGH SCHOOL BOYS & GIRLS LOCKER ROOMS



Lockers, fixtures, flooring, showers, and toilets were brought up to modern standards. Secure entrance and exit points were also added to eliminate unwanted traffic in those areas. Locker rooms and bathrooms had not been upgraded or improved since the school was built in 1957.

ADDITIONAL ENTRANCE AND EXIT CREATED OFF FIRST AVENUE



This entrance allows for a more efficient traffic flow to and from the school. Additionally, it provides a much safer environment by allowing emergency vehicles easier access to the rear of the school. The road opened in December 2017.

REPLACEMENT OF HIGH SCHOOL GYM ROOF



This new roof over the high school gym will last approximately 20 years and eliminates the need for costly on-going repairs.

RESURFACED AND EXPANDED FRONT PARKING LOT



It had been over 15 years since the lot was repaved and it was beyond temporary fixes. The front parking lot and the pick-up/drop-off circle was resurfaced. The addition of an extra 75 parking spaces nearly doubled the size of the front parking lot.

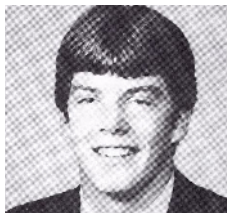

- Endow three new scholarships and support 31 existing scholarships to provide funding for deserving students.
- Provide tuition assistance to families who might otherwise be unable to afford a Catholic education.
- Purchase eight Project Lead the Way biomedical "Manikins" for use in high school science classrooms.

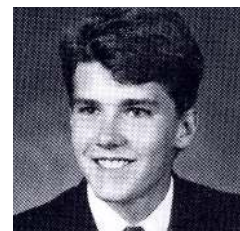
DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS

Fr. Michael A. Rossmann, SJ '03, was born and raised here in Iowa City where he graduated from Regina High School. He double majored in economics and theology at the University of Notre Dame, graduating in 2007, and was selected to be Valedictorian.

While in school, Fr. Rossmann was involved in campus ministry and the Center for Social Concerns; studied abroad in Uganda and Tanzania; and got to know a Jesuit professor there, who became influential in his discernment of the priesthood. Following college, he worked on an organic farm in Oregon for the summer and then joined the Society of Jesus in the fall of 2007.

Fr. Rossmann then attended Loyola University in Chicago, earning a master's degree in applied philosophy. He began writing for *The Jesuit Post*, a website dedicated to faith-based

commentary targeting young adults, and eventually became its editor-in-chief. In 2013, he was missioned to the Boston College School of Theology and Ministry, where he earned a Master of Divinity degree while serving as a deacon at St. Mary of the Annunciation Parish in Melrose, MA. He was ordained a priest on June 3, 2017, in Milwaukee, WI.

Father Rossmann returned to Regina this February to celebrate Mass during Catholic Schools Week. Rossmann said, "This was one of my favorite days since becoming a priest. I had so much fun going back to Regina and celebrating Mass for Catholic Schools Week 2018. Once a Regal, always a Regal!"

Teachers and staff who knew him or had him in their classes shared stories, hugs and high fives with this beloved alumnus who is the first Regina graduate in many years to go on to the priesthood. Students were listening intently to his homily and talking about how relatable he was.

And relatable he is. Currently, Fr. Rossmann lives in Chicago and does vocation promotion for the Jesuits all over the Midwest. He works with men in discernment, celebrates Masses, gives talks and leads retreats. Fr. Rossmann said he has continued his interest in using new media to share the faith and

he started the “one-minute homily” through *The Jesuit Post* that appears on social media every Sunday. These engaging video posts (much like written articles for *The Jesuit Post*) take on topics that deal with sacred and secular issues and everything in between, such as Jesus, politics and pop culture, the Catholic Church, sports and Socrates. The goal is to to speak to a younger generation in a way that most Catholic media does not. He said, “We discuss serious topics but also not take ourselves too seriously. We aim to show that faith is relevant to today’s culture and that God is already at work in it.”

His bio on *The Jesuit Post* includes this: “He finds the glory of God in LeBron James, cheap Indian buffets, and the Sunday New York Times with a cup

of coffee. Goals in life include meeting Tina Fey and getting people to spell his last name with two N’s.” Fr. Rossmann said he plans to continue serving in this role for a few years before starting a doctorate in theology. Whatever adventures he takes, he will continue to have an adoring fan base here in Iowa City, where we are very proud that he came “Straight Outta Regina.”

was named the Conference USA Coach of the Year after guiding the University of Alabama Birmingham women's basketball team to its most successful season in program history.



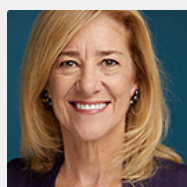
SANDRA (KIELENSTYN) MOSSMAN '67

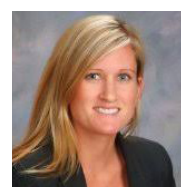
SUSAN (LUEBBERT) MOORE '97

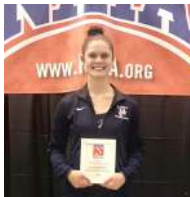

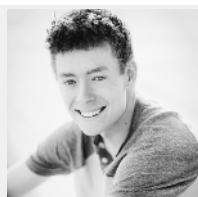

IOWA ROCK'N ROLL Hall of Fame

Three Regina alumni will be inducted into the IOWA ROCK 'N ROLL Hall of Fame this year in Arnolds Park, IA on the weekend of September 1st and 2nd, 2018!

The Trippers were an Iowa City band, formed in 1964 by high school friends and band members, Tom Nugent '66, guitar; Larry Dean '66, bass; Mike Kos '68, keyboards; along with Alden Snyder, City High Class of '66, drums. Nugent, Dean and Snyder still get together at least once a year in Southern California to replay some of those great rock tunes of the day. Mike Kos died in August 2014.

The Trippers were together for more than four and a half years. During that time they played an estimated 250 – 300 gigs.

Being a second generation rock band, they paved the way for many new mid-60's startup bands that played a broad range of venues in Eastern Iowa. For years, they were monthly regulars at Mom Uffelman's Spider Web and CYDC dances in Iowa City. They played for many University of Iowa Memorial

Union gigs, fraternity parties, high school proms and countless functions at rec centers and youth clubs.

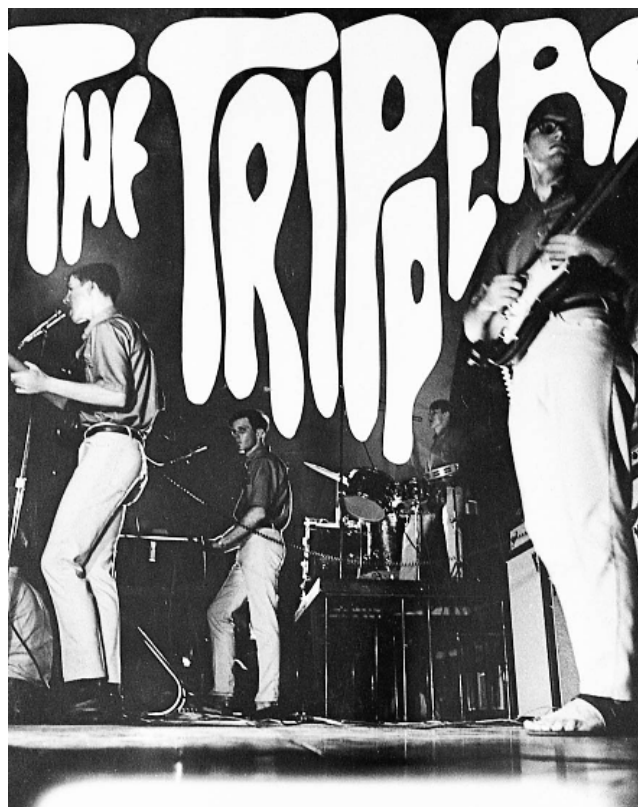
They played twice on top of the Dubuque parking ramp, opening for the Association in August of 1966.

Two years after forming their group the band embarked on a jingle career. They were signed by a company called New York Sounds Inc., out of Evanston, Illinois, to produce jingles and jingle music for large and small advertisers who wished to reach the large youth market. The firm hoped to give a breath of fresh sound to established jingles with work from The Trippers, who billed themselves as specializing in the "in" sounds of the 60's.

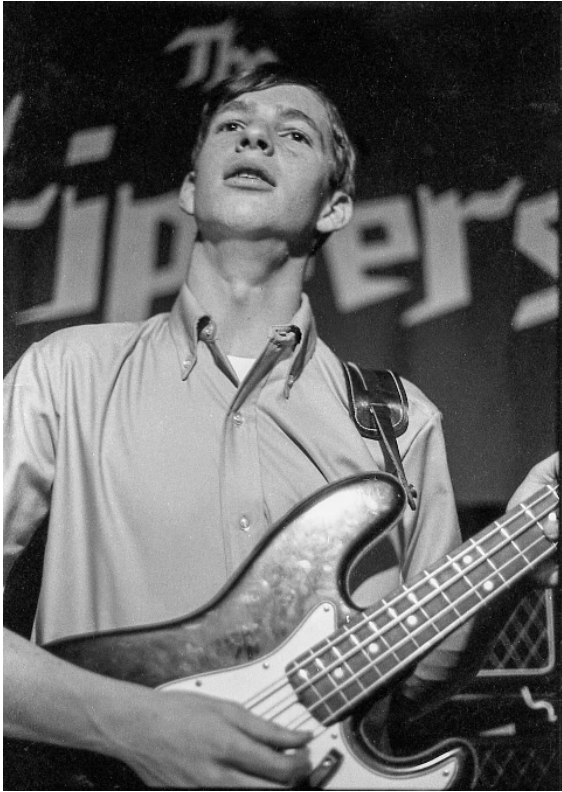

Regina Jr./ Sr. High was named a Silver Level Global High School by Catholic Relief Services. Regina is the first high school in the Diocese of Davenport to receive this distinction. Special thanks to RHS teacher Katie Welter and her husband Joe for helping bring the programs from CRS to Regina.

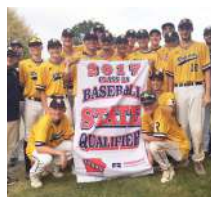

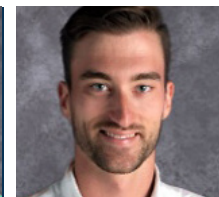
