The Foundation continues to work diligently to enhance the school's long-term financial strength. The \$450,000 EXCELLENCE FUND goal, with a fast-approaching June 30, 2019 end date, will provide important funding to meet operational needs and grow endowments for teacher salaries and tuition assistance. The endowments will pay out almost \$250,000 to the school this year, and a record number 66 student scholarships will be awarded.

Executive Director Kecia Boysen continues to provide the Foundation with strong leadership, supported by a talented team of Shelley Rublaitus, Shane Schemmel, and Katherine Weiner. I'm pleased to introduce Greg McLaughlin as the new Board president effective July 1, 2019. 03 Capital Campaign Update

It's time to complete what we started in 2016 when we launched the *Pride in Our Past, Building Our Future* Capital Campaign. Our goal then was to improve our facilities to better serve our students – and that goal remains. We are updating everyone on where we stand and defining our next steps in completing the projects included in Phase 1 of our master plan.

In January 2019, we conducted an assessment to lay the foundation for continuing the campaign. The results provided us with insight about the remaining projects and how best to move the campaign forward. Through the assessment, we learned:

- There is overwhelming support to complete the two remaining campaign projects – building a new Education Wing and expanding/updating the Early Childhood Center. There will also be improvements to the rear parking area during this process.
- 64% of assessment participants indicated that they will extend their current pledge or make an outright gift to the campaign to complete these two projects.
- Some respondents expressed concern that building the Regina Athletic Training Facility in Phase 1 indicates that Regina places greater importance on athletics over academics.
- Some participants voiced concerns about cost overruns on the completed projects and whether funds will be sufficient to complete the new Education Wing and Early Childhood Center projects.
- Finally, participants asked for more clarification about the completed projects and a vision to complete the Phase 1 projects. The response to that call for more communication began with a letter sent to all participants.

The intention was to complete the projects as specified in the master plan. Sometimes, however, an



opportunity presents itself, which means temporarily changing course. Regina's leadership evaluated the opportunity, in the form of a generous offer to fund a significant portion of the Regina Athletic Training Facility, and determined that it was in the school's best interest to accept the donation and rearrange the timing of the projects. Our school is grounded in the pursuit of an excellent faith-based education for our students, while ensuring they have opportunities for activities outside the classroom. Superior academics and quality extra-curricular activities make a power-

ful combination in a school – and that is what we seek

to provide at Regina.

At its April board meeting, Regina's leadership reaffirmed its commitment to complete the Education Wing and Early Childhood Center projects. The fundraising projections from the assessment, along with several new and very substantial financial pledges (more information about this exciting development coming in July), suggest that this is an achievable goal. We have also retained the Steier Group, who conducted the assessment and coordinated the previous portion of the campaign, to assist with the campaign continuation.







Projects Completed

Thanks to the generosity of the extended Regina family, our campaign total stands at \$4.8 million, with these projects completed:

- Expanded and resurfaced the front parking lot and resurfaced the front circle drive
- · Replaced the leaking high school gymnasium roof
- Constructed the new First Avenue entrance/exit drive
- Renovated the 60-year-old boys and girls locker rooms
- · Replaced the antiquated bell and intercom system
- Rerouted storm water retention (required by the city)
- Built and furnished the Regina Athletic Training Facility (while the training facility was not part of the initial Phase I projects, it was moved ahead of schedule when a donor generously offered to support its construction)

Based on current pledges and cash on hand, it is anticipated we will start the Education Wing this fall. We currently are in the final phases of construction planning and will be sharing our projected project timeline once the details are finalized.

We are excited about the future of the Regina Catholic Education Center. Our pursuit of excellence for our school and its students has never been stronger.

- Host "town hall" meetings in September to share campaign progress and provide updates about the master plan





60TH ANNIVERSARY DIAMOND JUBILEE ALUMNI

"FIRST AND FINEST"

Class of 1959

This award celebrates the first graduating class of Regina High School. When Regina opened in the fall of 1958, students from St. Mary, St. Patrick, University High and surrounding communities filled out Regina's first classes. On May 31, 1959, Regina held its first graduation with 51 seniors. Our first class is warmly known as "The First and Finest." They share a special bond and continue to gather monthly for lunch and socializing.

Msgr. James F. Parizek '64 Featured Alumnus





Monsignor James F. Parizek '64 passed away on February 3, 2018. He is remembered for his dry wit, colorful storytelling, gentle spirit and devotion to making the world kinder. Born and raised in Iowa City, he was the fourth of five children of Lester and Regina (Lekin) Parizek. He attended the newly opened Regina Catholic High School, graduating as covaledictorian in 1964. He graduated magna cum laude from St. Ambrose College in 1968 with a degree in philosophy and then earned a master's degree in theology from the American College of the University of Louvain in Belgium in 1972. On July 15 of that year, he was ordained to the priest-

hood by Bishop Gerald O'Keefe at St. Wenceslaus in Iowa City. His first assignment was as associate pastor at St. Paul the Apostle in Davenport.

Always striving for new ways to serve the Lord, Msgr. Parizek received his Canon Law degree from the Catholic University in Washington, D.C. in 1978. He served as secretary at the national office of the Canon Law Society and was appointed vice chancellor, judicial vicar and director of the tribunal where he served from 1981 until 2001. He received the title of Monsignor in 1989. He was appointed parochial vicar at Holy Family Parish in Davenport in 2001 and then pastor of Our Lady of Victory Parish in Davenport in 2002 until his retirement in 2016. He was named a Regina Distinguished Alumnus in 2016.

Msgr. Parizek had a special fondness for working with the hearing-impaired so that they, too, could hear the Word of God. He was instrumental in the development of a ministry to the hearing-impaired in the diocese and was active in serving this community. In 1979, he began providing Masses in sign language for deaf Catholics. Once a month for many years, he celebrated Mass by signing everything and he organized social events after the Masses.

Msgr. Parizek remembered his alma mater in his estate plans with a very generous gift. His family has directed the Regina Foundation to use these funds to endow a scholarship in his name. Multiple scholarships will be awarded annually, beginning in 2020, to assist students who choose a Regina Catholic education. Msgr. Parizek will be remembered into perpetuity at his alma mater through this scholarship and for his dedication and lifelong service.

Regina Alumna and media industry innovator, Kathy Dore '68, was the featured speaker at the University of Iowa's fall "Life With Phil" talk on November 8, 2018.

Her talk focused on sharing about her professional journey and why she strongly believes in giving back to Iowa and being philanthropic in general.

Kathy is currently the Senior Advisor of Vision and Strategy for consulting firm Proteus International. She previously served as president of broadcasting at Canwest Media and president of entertainment networks for Rainbow Media, overseeing cable networks AMC, IFC, WE, and Bravo.

Dore earned a Bachelor of Arts in speech communications from the University of Iowa in 1972, and a Masters of Business Administration from the UI Henry B. Tippie College of Business in 1984. She received the UI Alumni Association's Distinguished Alumni Award for Achievement in 1998, was named "Woman of the Year" in 2003 by Women in Cable Telecommunications, received Regina's Distinguished Alumni Award in 2004, and has been among Hollywood Reporter's annual list of "100 Most Powerful Women."

Kathy keeps an active connection with Regina through the *Kathleen Dore Scholarship for Women Leaders*. She designated the recipient to be a female graduating senior who has demonstrated the qualities of leadership, scholarship, and compassion throughout her high school years, and who plans to major in business. This year's recipient was Mary Catherine Graff.

REGINA CAMPUS



When Regina opened in 1958, the campus consisted of a rectory, chapel, convent, cafeteria, music-artsindustrial arts area, library, administrative space, gymnasium, locker rooms, and classroom areas. The athletic field was completed in 1962. Except for the convent, the building was one story, conforming to the terrain.



Today, the 22-acre campus includes baseball, soccer and football fields, a hard-surface track and new athletic training facility. The elementary wing opened in 1987. In 2004, a two-story addition was added with a new kitchen/cafeteria, science labs, seven jr/sr high school classrooms and a multi-purpose room. Four elementary classrooms were also added.

REGINA FACULTY

Regina's first faculty included eight Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary and six lay teachers. Four priests from the local parishes taught religion courses.





Now, 74 Regina faculty teach preschool- 12th grade students. One priest serves as school chaplain.




Regina boys baseball qualified for the state competition and played in the Championship game. They were the 2018 State Runner-up.
