Recruitment

New students—we have added four new students this past month.

Student Ambassadors- October meeting was October 8th. The students prepared Halloween treats for upcoming preschool Halloween trick or treating. Two of the ambassadors will assist in passing out treats at the Halloween parade. Ambassadors also prepared Thanksgiving envelopes for all Regina families. Student Ambassadors also prepared Snack Mix sacks for Admissions visits to area preschools.

Student Ambassadors will be greeters at the Foundation Donor Appreciation evening on October 20th.

Their next meeting is November 12th at 7:30 AM.

Tours/Shadows—tours and shadows are year round events.

Jr. High art students painted "candy corn pumpkins" for area preschools. Admissions picked up 40 pumpkins on October 3rd.

Admissions prepared a fall note for pumpkins thanking area preschools for their continued support of Regina.

Kindergarten – Round Up is scheduled for February 13, 2020 for the Class of 2033.

Preschool Outreach—35 area preschools received a Fall Gift and a treat bag from Regina, as well as a personal visit from Admissions—October 10th, 11th and 14th.

Parishes and the Newman Center had Regina Early Childhood and school brochures replenished. They also received a pumpkin and a treat bag on behalf of Regina. We are so appreciative of all their support.

International students—Regina currently is processing two international applications from Vietnam. One student would start this January 2020 and the other the Fall of 2020.

Baptismal records have been received from all four parishes. St. Thomas More and St. Wenceslaus have been completed. Admissions is in the process of entering St. Mary's and St. Patrick's—this will be completed by the second week of November.

Retention

Continuous enrollment proposal was presented at the July 17, 2019 Finance Committee. Starting with the 2020-2021 school year, we will be implementing this program. This will be an asset to our current Regina families in simplifying the registration process. Information will be provided to our two principals for newsletters late fall and again in January. Alan and Pam need to meet at the end of October to discuss next steps.

Parish Inserts promoting Regina, their Catholic school went in all parish bulletins August 3rd and 4th. We also shared them with The Newman Center and Hills parish. The next parish insert will be given to the parishes for mid November. This is currently being worked on with Admissions and Marketing.

Webinars: September 26th—10 Content Strategies Proven to Drive Enrollment Growth. A summary report was sent out afterwards and shared with Strategic Planning Chair and Administrative Team.

October 10th—Making the Connection Between School Growth and Healthy Boards. Dr. Bill Mott was the presenter. Notes will be shared with Board President and Administrative Team this week.

October 22, 2019 Board Report Alan Opheim Director – Finance / Operations

Business Office -

- The STO Program will gain much attention from several of us on this floor during the remainder of October and November. The STO as a whole is at approximately 30% of their goal. Regina is at 10% of our \$436,000 goal as assigned by the STO. Last year the "need factor" was over \$600,000 for us, so not meeting the STO goal has a major cash financial impact to the school.
- STO marketing will include direct contact with prior donors, elementary and high school newsletters, constant contact, Parish bulletins, and Regal Weekly. We are also looking at a more direct mailing to defined accountants and lawyers reminding them of the lowa Tax Credit for their clients.
- STO Basic features 65% Iowa Tax <u>Credit</u> for most taxpayers. Available for business or individuals. For certain taxpayers they may still have a Federal Tax Deduction. For more information, <u>www.stoseiowa.org</u>.
- The budget process has started. If any Board members wish to be on the meeting notification list for this period of time, please let me know. All Board members are invited to any and all sessions.
- Run for the Schools is this coming Sunday, October 27. It is not too late to sign up to participate or volunteer.

Building & Grounds

- The camera that was taken down when the mods came down, has been attached to a pole and is now
 active again. We will continue to watch for opportunities to purchase and expand our network of
 cameras.
- Meetings with Build To Suit (BTS) have started. To begin, formal meetings are expected to be one time
 per month, but phone calls and short meetings will be done as needed during construction, of which 2
 occurred this week.
- Construction Update Work has officially started on the Academic Wing with the signed contract received from the Diocese this week. Immediate areas will be foundation work, as well as the construction of an electrical room. This will necessitate some short term closures of exterior doors. The daytime custodial crew will monitor correct usage of "exit signs" during these periods of change.
- Due to the fact that we did not change out any carpets this past summer, we are exploring the possibility
 of replacing two of the worst carpets during Christmas break. Quotes and interest / time availability of
 vendors are being sought at this time.

Elementary Band is off and running. There are 50 5th graders and 28 6th graders in band this year.

We have nearly maxed out our use of school-owned instruments.

6 school-owned flutes

- 2 school-owned trumpets
- 1 school-owned horn
- 4 school-owned euphoniums (one 7th grader)
- 3 school-owned trombones

I like to have at least one of every instrument in working condition at school. When students forget their instruments, I'd rather they have the option to play on a school-owned instrument for a band lesson, rather than have to miss a lesson. For large group band class, I can't spend class time getting school-owned instruments out of storage for students, so they have to do without an instrument and clap along with the rhythm. I distribute school-owned instruments to anyone who asks until we run out. This year, we came close to running out. I would not want a student to have to not join band because the cost of an instrument was prohibitive and the school-owned instruments were all spoken for, but I don't have a better system. Ideally, any low-income families would be able to get a school-owned instrument for their band student. Since I don't have access to that kind of sensitive information, I can't reserve instruments for the neediest students.

I came across information distributed by the Iowa Bandmasters Association yesterday about grants that schools can apply for to pay for things that the school budget doesn't cover. Supplement, not supplant, was the terminology. It specifically mentioned purchasing musical instruments. Maybe that is something I'll have to look into for next year.
