

Questions and Answers for Online Learning

GENERAL DESCRIPTION- March 13, 2020 until the end of the school year last year was voluntary for schools. This year, online learning, for the families who choose this option or in the event classroom instruction moves to online for the safety of your student, is considered **mandatory**. Each district has been required to offer a form of online learning as a part of their Return to Learn Plan.

DEVICES-We have Chromebooks ordered for grades 1st-5th. 6th graders already have Chromebooks assigned. Kindergarten students will use i-Pads. Devices are back ordered at this time due to demand. If you are someone who will need to check-out a device for immediate use for your online learning at home, please let us know.

LEARNING MATERIALS- Online learners will have a scheduled day to pick up textbooks and learning materials. Details to come.

ONLINE LEARNING REQUIREMENTS:

1. Google Classroom will be used for K-6 as the learning platform.
2. All students have been assigned a Google account. You will receive your login information from the homeroom teacher.
3. Online learning will be delivered by the students' homeroom teacher.
4. Attendance will be taken for online learners each day between 8:00 and 8:30 am.
 - a. Families will log into a Google Meet with their homeroom teacher.
5. All grades K-6 have been blocked in a master schedule for ELA (English Language Art), Math, Religion, and switch subjects (Science/Social Studies/English). This allows all students learning at home to be on the same subject at the same time as in person learners. ****Please see Master Online Learning K-6 Daily Schedule****
6. Expected online time for online learners includes: Core ELA, Math Core, Religion, Afternoon Switch Class/Classes.
7. Learning will happen live in the major subjects as online learners join the classroom via Google Meet.
8. Recorded lessons will be available in the Google Classroom for families that need to view them at a different time.
9. All online learners will be submitting their work electronically to the Google Classroom.
10. There will be built in breaks for recess and lunch. This will be offline time for online learners.
11. Specials content will be available via the homeroom teachers' Google Classroom.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

1. Teachers are being trained on Google Classroom both over the summer and during in-service days.
2. We ask for patience as we get this up and running.
3. We have hired a Remote Learning Coordinator to help teachers and families as we navigate this together. There will be a way to email to a "help line" if there are questions.
4. When we have times of exposure and will need to move to online learning, classroom presentation may come from the homeroom teacher or other teachers of your child's grade level.

This is a monumental endeavor for all involved. We know that it will take time for teachers to get used to presentation to the whole class (in-person and online learners). We hope to build a routine, so that we can best help our students and parents with online learning. This information is subject to change.
