

Face Covering Guidelines

All students and staff will wear:

- a double layer (or greater) face mask or double layer (or greater) gaiter that covers the mouth and nose
- or a combination of a double layer (or greater) face mask or double layer (or greater) gaiter with a face shield

The CDC no longer recommends the use of face shields as a stand-alone face covering. Therefore, face shields are only allowed at Regina when worn in combination with a mask or double layer gaiter.

Bandanas and face shields **do not count as a face covering*

Student and Staff face coverings can be:

- Patterns or solid color
- “Regina” or “Regals” may be printed on the face mask/shield
- No other words/slogans/advertising/etc.
- No inappropriate patterns or symbols (ie. no weapons, fangs, alcohol, marijuana leaves, etc.)
- Administrators have final determination on what is an appropriate face covering

A face covering(s) need to be worn at all times while on campus.

- Exceptions:
 - a mask break with six foot social distancing as directed by a teacher or staff member
 - lunch (six foot distancing and/or barriers will be used)
 - regulations pertaining to athletic and music competitions and activities

Students and staff will be responsible for washing their face coverings regularly. Students and staff should avoid wearing the same mask/shield each day without washing the mask/shield.

If a mask is determined to be dirty by a staff member, a student will be asked to replace it with a different face mask or given a disposable mask from the office. If a shield is determined to be dirty by a staff member, a student will be asked to sanitize the mask to bring it up to compliance.

If a mask becomes dirty or unusable, the office will provide a mask.

It is recommended for students and staff to have multiple masks available to them in their backpacks each day to change their face mask if it becomes dirty or unusable.

Students who repeatedly fail to comply with the face covering mandate may be moved to online learning for the safety of other students and staff.
