



12<sup>th</sup> Grade Registration Information for 2021-2022

We are so excited to plan for another school year. Every spring and summer our administration works diligently to create a schedule that works for each student.

This year, we will use this document to share information. DO NOT return this paper to us. This is just a tool to use in the planning process. The student will first select their classes online through JMC. Once selected, then the office will print off the student's schedule to be sent home. The parent/guardian and the student should discuss if the chosen classes are right for them. Once approved, the parent/guardian should sign the form.

**Please return the printed form with parent/guardian signature, along with the annual \$100 registration fee no later than February 26th, 2021.**

General information:

- There are 8 class periods. Students must have 7 of the 8 class periods filled with academic courses each semester. An academic course is defined as a course where students can earn credit. The remaining 1 class period can be filled with learning center time, study hall late arrival or early release. Students can have all 8 class periods filled with academic coursework.
- Most classes are scheduled for both A and B days. Senior Seminar and PE are courses on an alternating day schedule (i.e. Psychology on A days and PE on B days) throughout both semesters.
- The *Course Description Guide* at [Regina.org](http://Regina.org) is available to review the full course descriptions, typical sequences and additional information.
- This registration request process allows Regina to best plan for teacher and section numbers. It is important to register for the classes you intend to take. Course offerings may change based on student interest and teacher availability.

Options include: English 12, AP English Language &amp; Composition, or AP English Literature.</p> <p><b>Social Studies</b> If students did not take Economics (or AP) and Government (or AP), they must include that in their schedule for senior year.</p> <p><b>Science, Math and Other Courses</b> While not required, a fourth credit in both Science and Math are highly encouraged for college preparations. Review the graduation credit requirements and <i>Credit Checker</i> in JMC to view other required courses that are needed for Senior year.</p>

How to Officially Register for the 2021 - 2022 School Year in JMC

1. On the student Chromebook, go to [Regina.onlinejmc.com/student](http://Regina.onlinejmc.com/student)
2. Switch the year at the top to say *2021-2022*.
3. Log on to the student account.
4. On the left, click the tab labeled *Course Registration*.
5. Once there, on the right column, required courses should already be listed.
6. In the left column, click on the courses you intend to take. It will appear in the right hand column. Select additional required course subjects (For example: Math, Health) first, followed by other electives.
7. Note: Do not register for alternative courses. Only register for the courses you plan to take.
8. When complete, review the list to confirm it has all of the correct courses. It should reflect 7 or 7.5 credits registered at the bottom of the page, if requesting no-credit courses, such as Learning Center or Study Hall. The list should reflect 8 credits if selecting all credit-bearing courses. Students should have no more than 8 credits, with the exception of a student who adds Early Bird Choir.
9. Log out. That's it!

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
